Harvesting was completed during the spring of 2021; as such 2 growing seasons have occurred.

The cutting notice includes a provision for post-harvest replanting if needed. My field exam indicates the stand is adequately stocked with a mix of natural oak, maple, and birch seedlings/saplings. Average density of seedlings and saplings in stand 1 is between 850 and 900 per acre. Therefore no supplemental re-stocking is recommended. RRS
